



Job Title: Horse Instructor

Classification: Temporary- up to 12 weeks (May 26-August 23, 2020) - Salaried

Position Purpose:

This position will oversee the activities, programs, and Learning Centers of the horse program. This is a mission experience that contributes to the fulfillment of the objectives of the program ministry.

Essential Job Functions:

- Outline lesson plans to teach Learning Centers that meet Camp Conquest ministry and safety guidelines as well as ACA standards.
- Communicate and demonstrate riding skills as well as helping campers learn skills.
- Control riding ring when in use.
- Lead campers in both ground lessons and riding lessons.
- Assist the Barn Manager in maintaining the barn, riding ring, and equipment.
- Assist the Barn Manager in caring for the horses and fields.

Other Job Duties:

- As a member of the staff, you will assist with weekly preparation of the camp for the next group of volunteers and campers.
- Be available and willing to run/participate in other camp programs

Relationships:

You will be able to work with the Barn Manager, Horsemanship Instructor, and volunteers to accomplish your goals. The Program Coordinator will oversee this role and communication with him/her and the Overnight Camp and Day Camp Coordinators will be important.

Equipment Used:

Horses, riding equipment, grooming equipment, cleaning equipment, gator.

Qualifications:

Candidate must have current CHA certification and some experience with horses is preferred.
Candidate must be at least 18 years old in order to be trained to operate some equipment.
Candidate should have the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities that pertain to the position.
Candidate should have and be able to communicate a relationship with Jesus Christ.
Candidate must be able to honor the Camp Conquest Statement of Faith and Core Values.

Physical Aspects of the Job:

Candidate will be responsible for all barn work including cleaning the barn and fields, caring for the horses, and organizing equipment. Candidates should be able to function in a natural, outdoor environment. Camp itself involves a lot of walking and requires good management of down time.
